PASTOR'S CORNER

Let me start by saying thank you for allowing Connie and me to be part of what God is doing here at East Balsam Baptist Church. I'm a history kind of guy, and I've loved learning about the history of the church, seeing God's hand in its founding and in its continuance. It seems that there have been a few times over the years when circumstances seemed to say that perhaps it was time to close the doors, but each time faithful men and women of God looked beyond the circumstances and continued the mission that God set before them. Today there is a strong and vibrant congregation, and enthused and qualified leaders, because of the foundation laid by those who went before. As I've interacted with the Deacons, the Executive Council and the Search Committee I've been impressed by the sense of unity and common purpose that exists here. I'm sure there are areas that some disagree with others; that's actually healthy, but there is a unity of spirit and faith in God's provision that bodes well for the future. If you're fairly new to EBBC let me encourage you to pick up a copy of the church history and read it for yourself, and then spend a few moments in prayer, thanking God for His work here over the past 115 years.

As you're thanking Him for His past work, also ask God to continue to lead and guide those in leadership as they continue the search for a permanent pastor. I was able to share some of my pastoral experiences with the Search Committee a few days ago and talked about the need to see beyond the facts of resumes and cover letters to understand the heart and burden a true shepherd carries. I know that God has already selected His under shepherd for His flock here at EBBC, now the task is to listen to His voice and follow His leading in the process. James says, "If any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to him. But he must ask in faith, without doubting ... "We all need God's wisdom in making life decisions, and perhaps there is no decision that is more important than the one you are engaged in making. So, as you're thanking God for the past, and praying for His leading and guidance, follow James' counsel and specifically ask for wisdom for each person in leadership, and for the congregation as a whole. That has been my prayer for you for the last weeks and will continue to be my prayer as we go forward together in the next few months.

Finally, as I close my little corner of the newsletter, let me mention a couple of other things. First, the weekend marriage conference the end of this month. If you're married or plan to be married, this will be well worth your time.

And then, I'm already looking forward to the Easter season. I know, we just took down the Christmas decorations, but now is the time to begin praying for relatives, friends, coworkers, neighbors and others who do not know Jesus as their savior. Easter is a time that many people are willing to be your guest at worship that might not be willing most times of the year. So, begin praying that God will soften hearts so they can 'hear' the Good News that God loves them, and that Jesus died so that they might have life.


Probably the only person in our congregation who would go that high on a step ladder.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD (OCC)—

OCC blesses children around the world with gift-filled shoeboxes that becomes an opportunity to share the gospel of Jesus Christ with these children. A child will only receive one box in their life time. This last year we sent 280 boxes off. It was very over whelming for me to see the gifts that came in, purchased or made and the number of boxes filled. We did multiple labels for tracking purposes. Some boxes were sent out on 12/2/19; these boxes went to Namibia. Namibia is located in Southern Africa bordering the Atlantic Ocean. People of Namibia consist of at least 11 ethnic groups. Some boxes went to undisclosed countries; these are countries where the gospel is not received well, but partners of Samaritan's Purse are there working with the people. A total of 10,569,405 boxes were collected in 2019.

The Packing Date for 2020 OCC Boxes is November 14, 2020!

I would like to thank Jen Jorgenson and Rhonda Miller for being my sounding board and push to make it a positive mission for EBBC. Thank you to all who donated both items and money and keeping OCC in your prayers. Thank you for all who came to pack boxes and help load them. Our van can hold 300.... let's strive for that in 2020! We have now moved into the next phase of our search. At our last meeting, we started to look at resumes for those that have applied so far. I think this is an exciting time as we finally get to see who might be the next pastor for our church. I ask that you would all pray for us and for the man that God has already chosen to serve here next. We want to be open to God's leading as we look at resumes.

Bruce & Candice Beatham—Wycliffe Bible Translators in Mexico

I asked Bruce & Candice for an update. Candice answered that they have hit the ground running after spending some wonderful and needed time with ALL of their kids over Christmas break.

This past year they received their pins for 20 years of service with Wycliffe Bible Translators. "We want to thank you, our financial, prayer and encouragement team, for your faithfulness to God in supporting the ministry He has given to all of us – to bring God's Word to the Mixtec people in their own language."

The translation of God's Word continues to move forward in two languages. They also teach literacy classes, read portions of the translation with people to see how well it communicates to them, and have discussions to agree on the best way to translate tricky terms. A young lady named Eli has joined their team by taking on the job of "back-translating" the Mixtec translation of the book of Mark into Spanish for a consultant to review.

They also have two Mixtec helpers, Valentin and Ernesto. Ernesto spends his Saturdays making trips back to his village to help teach children's ministries that were started as a result of having Samaritan's Purse outreaches there. These kids are hungry for God's Word. Please pray for these children and the leaders so they accept God's salvation.

They have found a church where they can serve the Lord, are getting to know people in the mobile park, and are about half an hour drive from Mark and Erin.

They are still working for Wycliffe, Steve as a consultant for translators and Carol Jean as an Administrative Assistant helping people who are going to the mission field with Wycliffe. One of their first tasks is to raise more support.

Erin and Mark welcomed a son, Wilder John Anderson, into their home on January 14th. At first three-year old Eowyn didn't like his loud crying but now she is happy to be the Big Sister.

Steve & Rhonda Schwarze—

Steve and Rhonda were at EBBC on September 1st to say thank you for support over the last 35 years, and goodbye. Their last official day as missionaries was December 31, 2019. On December 30th they were driving home from their final speaking event as missionaries. Their comment, "It is with mixed emotions that we close out this chapter and begin a new adventure."
