PASTOR'S CORNER

On April 9-10 I attended the Saint Croix Valley Men's Retreat at Oak Forest Center in Frederic along with eleven other men and youth from EBBC. I had a great time, and there are several reasons why I am glad that I went and why I am looking forward to going again next year, Lord willing.

First, and most importantly, the retreat gave me an opportunity to step away from "normal life" and focus on God. It truly was a spiritual *retreat*, and I left feeling refreshed and invigorated. The retreat included meaningful times of worship, prayer, and fellowship. It also gave me a chance to sit under the preaching of the word, which is something that pastors do not get to do very often. I love preaching at EBBC every week, but sometimes it's good for preachers to sit down and hear someone else preach.

Speaking of preaching, I did have the privilege of speaking during the Saturday morning session at the retreat, and that is the second reason why I am glad that I went. I had a lot of fun speaking to a room of about one hundred men. It was a treat, and a unique opportunity that doesn't come along very often! My message was from Hebrews 10:19-25. The theme of the retreat was "Jesus, Anchor of My Soul," so in my message I sought to answer the question, "How can we stay anchored to Jesus?" I shared three ways to do that from the text: we must draw near to God in faith, we must hold fast to our hope in Jesus, and we must stir up one another in love.

The third reason why I am glad that I went to the retreat is that it allowed me to continue building relationships with some of the men from EBBC. I haven't even been at EBBC for one year, so I'm still getting to know the church family. The Covid-19 pandemic has also made it a little more challenging to get together outside of Sunday morning worship. So, I'm grateful for the time that I was able to spend with men from our church, and I hope that even more men from EBBC will join us at the retreat in 2022. I also enjoyed the time that I spent with men from other churches, and especially the other pastors who were at the retreat. As far as I can tell, Polk County is blessed to have many healthy, biblical churches and faithful, godly men leading those churches.

Finally, I am glad that I went to the retreat because it was an excellent experience all around. Oak Forest Center is in a beautiful location, and even though it was wet and cool outside, it was refreshing to be out in nature. The staff was wonderful, the food was incredible, and the facility itself is beautiful. Remarkably, the entire retreat (food, accommodations, sessions, etc.) cost less

than most hotel stays. My only regret is that the retreat was over so quickly, but the length of the retreat works out well for most men because they can go without having to miss work.

I plan to attend the Saint Croix Valley Men's Retreat again next year (I would enjoy speaking again, too!) and I hope that a good group of men from EBBC will join me. It's important for all of us to take time away from the daily grind to focus on our relationship with God, and it is good for us to make time for fellowship with other Christians for mutual encouragement. We cannot live godly and joy-filled lives apart from community. That is one of the points that I made in my message at the retreat. As it says in Hebrews 10:24-25, "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

Thanks to the men from EBBC who joined me at the retreat, thanks to Oak Forest Center for their excellent service, and thanks to the deacons and EBBC family for allowing me a little time away from my normal responsibilities.

Anika Enger's birthday was April 14th. Cake was served following the worship service on April 11th.



MISSIONS

Bruce & Candice Beatham—Wycliffe Bible Translators in Mexico

Greetings from warm, sunny Oaxaca (wah-HAH-kah)! Our rainy season starts in late May/early June, so for now we are fairly warm and dry – having to ration our water to make it to the next time our part of the town gets city water sent to it.

Our update isn't very much further along since the last time we wrote to you. We are still waiting for the Covid situation to mellow out before we can publicly present the **book of Mark** in Coicoyán (coy-coy-YAHN). We just need the consultant approval for the introduction and a few glossary entries to publish **John**. The guys think they are a week away from sending the **book of Luke** to a consultant for her to check. We are praying about getting the **Luke video** produced this year, but we need 11 good readers to do that! Eight of those should be men, but we have many more women who are good readers than men.

Will you pray with us that God will supply men that we can teach to read their language to be able to produce this video? Maybe by the time we are allowed to plan an event in the village, we'll have Mark, Luke, John and the Luke video to share with everyone!

I made a trip to the village to encourage some of my sisters in Christ who are having some hard times. I took my walking partner (Gudelia) with me. She's Valentín's sister-in-law and my good friend. She doesn't speak Mixtec. We were able to share the Gospel with a young woman and also leave our newly published literacy books with friends to sell in their store. So exciting!

Thank you for your wonderful support of what God is doing in Mixtec-land.

John & Lori De Cleene—Mobilization Associates, Converge

This past month has been exciting in Converge International Missions Mobilization: two families left for the field in March. One family was actually in the airport - on a connecting flight to go to their field last month when their country closed! They flew to Orlando. Weeks later they received a call at 9:00 pm and were on a plane the next day at 3:00 pm! A third family reached full support in March and is waiting for their country to open.

Additionally, two appointee families, one on the east coast, one here in the Midwest, each had 10 minutes in front of their home/sending churches. Both were well received with those in attendance asking to be on their prayer letter list and even asking for appointments. Please pray for the 64 appointees as they meet with churches and individuals to build their teams.

Next month, Lord willing, we will have another "Launch" where we train new appointees how to build their support team. One of these families will open a new country for Converge. Pandemic concerns are still significant, so please pray for wisdom as we plan for this training. When people pray, we see how God moves!

Steve & Carol Jean Gallagher—Wycliffe Bible Translators-Florida

Translation consultant work: Steve has been working remotely with the Mandara team in Papua New Guinea to provide quality assurance for their translation of Genesis. He is beginning to work with the Etulo translation team in Nigeria and will be mentoring translation consultant trainees during the consulting process.

Translation resource development: Steve has begun working with a team to produce translation guidebooks in easy English, called Translator's Notes, for teams throughout the world. He is assigned to the book of Exodus, to provide examples of valid ways to express the meaning for each part of every verse. He is also taking an online Hebrew refresher course with Jerusalem Seminary, which will help with this work.

Use of the translated Scriptures: It's been exciting to hear of the December 2020 publication and distribution of the Gizrra New Testament in Papua New Guinea. Steve worked as a consultant for them in 2018. The Binandere team, which Steve worked with in 2019, recently submitted portions of their New Testament for printing.

Mobilization and recruitment: Carol Jean is an administrative assistant for the mobilization team of Wycliffe. Her team is sharing about ways to become involved in Bible translation to more people than ever through online means: webinars, virtual job fairs, and job postings. They are hoping to resume in-person events this fall.

Prayer points:

- Pray for Steve and the Mandara and Etulo translation teams as they work to assure the quality of translated Scriptures.
- Pray that the Translator's Notes resources will be a great help to teams all over the world.
- Pray that the Bariai people, with whom the Gallaghers worked for 24 years, and other language groups would read God's Word more and more and that the Holy Spirit would transform their lives.
- Pray for more people to join the Bible translation movement.

The Gallagher express their thanks to the church for the prayers and financial partnership.
