# PASTOR'S CORNER

### Learning and Connecting

In recent weeks I've had two different opportunities to learn and connect with others, and I have another opportunity coming up later this week. I attended an event at Wood Lake Camp & Retreat Center called "Trailblazer Weekend" September 28-30, and I attended the Converge Great Lakes district conference called "Foundations" October 5-6, which was held at Valleybrook Church in Eau Claire this year. On Friday of this week (October 20), I will be heading to Bethel University for "Pastor Prayer, Coffee, and Chapel" with guest speaker Francis Chan. I'll share a little more about each of these.

#### Trailblazer Weekend

Earlier this fall I received a postcard from Wood Lake advertising the Trailblazer Weekend event. I immediately thought that it would be a wonderful opportunity for our youth leaders here at EBBC to get away together for a few days to learn together, strengthen our unity as a team, and connect with other youth leaders in the area. I'm happy to report that (from my perspective) all three of those goals were achieved. Our group was the biggest group in attendance. Sarah Bowers (our Director of Youth Ministries), Travis Bowers, Danielle Panik, Holly Wood Webster, Christine Spading, and myself attended. The ladies had one cabin, and Travis and I shared a different cabin. I'm sure that the ladies had some good bonding time. Travis and I got to know each other better, and he even had the privilege of hearing me talk in my sleep (about fishing, of course)!

Each day we shared meals together, enjoyed some down time, and gathered for session. The food was great, and the sessions were filled with meaningful worship (lead by camp director Dan Hartke) and encouraging messages. The speaker for the weekend was Herb Bloomquist from Camp Shamineau in Minnesota, who has many years of experience working with youth. His first message focused on the importance of having friends and supporters and doing ministry as a team. His second message was about caring for the kids who have trouble connecting with others, and he encouraged us to remember that even the most difficult kids can be transformed by God's grace. His final message was about the Kingdom of God, and how our goal as youth leaders should be to give kids a glimpse of God's kingdom. I had a fantastic experience at Wood Lake, and it seemed like the other leaders from our church did, too. I'm glad for the time I got to share with them, learning and growing together for the sake of our youth and for the glory of God. Even though I'm not the "youth pastor" at EBBC, I consider it a privilege to serve with the youth ministry. I enjoy spending time with the youth, and I want them to know that their pastor cares about them and considers them an important part of the church family. I don't see myself as having "graduated" from youth ministry, because the youth are just as much a part of the church as any other age group, and the Lord has called me to shepherd everyone who calls EBBC "their" church. So, I am thankful for Wood Lake, for EBBC's support of Wood Lake, and for the opportunity I had to be further equipped for ministering to the youth of our church.

#### **Foundations Conference**

Since being called to EBBC in 2020, I've grown to appreciate our Converge Great Lakes district more and more. Before then, I didn't know much about Converge. I didn't know what a "LEAD Team" was, and I didn't know that our district had an annual conference and an annual business meeting. Back in 2017, I read something in an email from Converge (our denomination) about the value of coaching for pastors, and interested pastors were encouraged to contact their district office to learn more about coaching opportunities. I did so and received an invitation from our Regional President, Ken Nabi, to join a group he was leading, which he called a "leadership discipleship group." That was my first significant introduction to Converge. Since coming to EBBC, I've participated in our West LEAD Team, which includes of EBBC, Grace Church (Osceola), Living Waters Church (our new church plant in St. Croix Falls), Faith Fellowship (Luck), Trade Lake Baptist Church (Trade Lake), First Baptist Church (Falun), Grace Church (Grantsburg), First Baptist Church (Webster), and Cumberland Baptist Church (Cumberland). We often have our meetings at EBBC, since it is a more central meeting place. I'm grateful for the opportunities we have to meet together for prayer and encouragement, and to work together on shared efforts like church planting. Most of the pastors from our LEAD Team attended the Foundations conference.

Like the event at Wood Lake, the Foundations conference included excellent food, meaningful worship, opportunities for relationship building, and time to learn. Our speaker for the conference was Chad Moore from Sun Valley Community Church in Arizona. The topics of his messages were the importance of humility in pastoral ministry, how discipleship must include obedience which can only take place in relationships, and the temptations of leadership. I also attended a few workshops that had to do with solo pastoring in small communities and counseling. It was great to visit with people who have helped me in my journey of learning how to be a pastor, like Ken Nabi, Glenn Herschberger, Gary Harrison, Pastor Tim Haugen, and Pastor Joe Basso. I also got to connect with one of our missionaries, John De Cleene, and make many new connections. It was an excellent conference, and I would like to say "thank you" to EBBC for your ongoing support, which includes money budgeted to help pay for opportunities like this.

#### **Pastor Prayer, Coffee, and Chapel**

On Friday morning (October 20), I will drive to Bethel University for this free event that I was invited to attend. It will be a gathering of other pastors for prayer and networking, and to hear some updates about Bethel University. Additionally, we are all invited to attend the college chapel service that morning and hear from Francis Chan, who is the speaker that day. For those who don't know, Bethel University is the college that Anika and I attended, and Bethel is also the only university affiliated with our denomination, Converge. I have not been back to Bethel for many years, and I have not attended a chapel service since my senior year in 2008. Bethel has gone through some changes in the 15 years since I graduated, and I'm looking forward to learning more about Bethel today. I'm also looking forward to meeting other pastors and getting to hear Francis Chan during chapel.

Once again, I just want to say thank you to the church family at EBBC for your continued support. I know that October is "pastor appreciation month," but I also want you to know how much I appreciate you. Thank you for

caring for me and encouraging me to be connected with other pastors, to maintain a healthy work-life balance, and to keep growing as a leader and follower of Jesus.

# CHURCH HAPPENINGS

## Youth

We have kicked off a new youth group year at EBBC. This year's focus is **Activating Authentic Faith.** We want to help the students truly own their relationship with the Lord and live a life of authentic faith. In doing so, we hope they will greatly impact our community for the Lord. We believe the Lord will use this year to reach all 2,974 teens in Polk County with the Gospel.

The year started with three new decisions to surrender to Jesus and eight people being baptized as an act of faith and obedience to Jesus. What a beautiful example from God of what Authentic Faith looks like.

One of the ways we are helping the students activate *authentic* faith is in our high school small groups. This year, we are creating multiple high school small groups that will be student-led, with an adult present to keep students on track and help answer questions. It is our hope that in having weekly transparent conversations with other students their own age, our high schoolers will grab ahold of all Jesus has to offer.

Here are some things our High School "leaders" are saying:

- There was some deeper sharing of personal struggles regarding time management and priorities, as well as the converse of having too much time to dwell in one's own thoughts. They have encouraged each other with ideas of what has worked for them, followed with prayer.
- Last week, we had some admit that their prayers are never answered, others admit that they struggle to want to follow God, others say they can't really hear his voice, and many say that they simply don't have

time to be with Him. However, they also dialogued through HOW to hear his voice, how to stay encouraged when your prayers aren't answered, and how to make time for him (including challenging each other to delete social media apps for a week).

• My group has talked about things they are struggling with, ways they have seen God at work and questions they have about faith. Currently they are also working to hold each other accountable when it comes to getting into Gods word every day, as they all expressed, they wanted to deepen their relationship with Him!

We are also spending the first hour of our time together in worship, prayer, testimony, and a large group teaching. Seth Alen and Ella Bowers are leading our worship team, working to bring others up front to share their gifts. The students seem to respond well to the messages shared during this time.

Our Seniors (all 14 of them) are trying to meet monthly while also discussing struggles and successes in our relationship with Jesus throughout the week via text message. We are also beginning to plan our Senior Trip in January to Atlanta, GA, for the Passion Conference.

This October, we also began a young adult group meeting on Wednesdays with the rest of the students. At this time, we have about 3-4 young women gathering and are hoping to create a space for individuals in this integral season of their lives.

We are very excited for what this next year has to hold and appreciate the support and prayers of our church family.

Hi! We are doing well! Since we're living near our linguistics center in Mitla right now, the things that we have been mostly focusing on are our jobs as supervisors of field teams and digital resource developer for the Mexico Branch.

We will eventually be adding remote work in the translation project to our daily routine here as well. Meanwhile, we're praying for God to renew our strength and the vision for how He is calling us to be involved in each of the aspects of the work that He has planned for us. We're also praying that during this time the two Mixtec translators we work with will grow in taking more ownership of the translation project, growing in the confidence and willingness to continue the steps in the project that they are actually better at doing than we are.
